QING PERIOD NORTHERN PLANK ROAD SCROLL MAP SET III – JITOU GUAN – QIPAN GUAN

The images in this document are derived from a complete high resolution scan of a 17 metre long scroll preserved and held by the <u>Geography & Map Division</u> of the <u>US Library of Congress</u>. The scroll map shows the main road from the Wei River valley of Shaanxi Province (陕西省) to the border with Shu (Sichuan) in the Qing Period. The pages are to be read from the last page to the first, starting in Set I at the walled city of Baoji (宝鸡) on the last page to finish on the border between Shaanxi and Sichuan Province (四川省) at Qipanguan (七盘关) in Set III at its front page. Facing pages are contiguous. There is a section of the road including Mianxian (勉县) that is missing from the scroll. It was purchased by Arthur W. Hummel (Heng Muyi, 恒慕义) in China in 1930.
